It's important that we beat cancer across the UK, and that means a smokefree future for *all*.

I would like to schedule a meeting with you to discuss how you can play your part in beating our number one cause of cancer by pledging to be a Smokefree MP on behalf of everyone affected by smoking and cancer in [constituency]. By becoming a Smokefree MP you will commit to support action to prevent young people from starting smoking and funding to help people quit.

In 2015, we gained a huge victory for public health by voting in favour of plain, standard cigarette packs, giving people one less reason to start smoking. However, there is also evidence to show that the effectiveness of some of these measures can decrease over time as people who smoke become more used to them. We've made progress, but a smokefree UK won't be achieved without real action.

Evidence clearly shows factors outside of individuals' control impact their likelihood of smoking. But when governments take action, smoking rates go down. Now, I am asking you join me in taking the next step in the fight against cancer. Please join me in making smoking obsolete and saving lives.
