You and your students can give children in remote and hard-to-reach communities the right to childhood. Together with your students, you can help provide life-changing essentials, such as the items below, to where they're needed around the world:



\$20 can provide basic school essentials like pencils and exercise books, to give 37 children the chance to learn.



\$50 can provide 17 bed nets to protect children from malaria-infected mosquito bites.



\$100 can provide 212 children with enough clean and safe water for drinking, bathing and household use.



\$250 can provide measles vaccines for 250 children to be protected from this highly contagious and preventable disease.



\$500 can send 8 girls to school and equip them with the skills and selfconfidence needed to lift themselves out of poverty and become the leaders in their communities.
