Sri Lankan journalist Prageeth Eknaligoda disappeared shortly after leaving work on Jan. 24, 2010. Two days earlier, he had published an article critical of President Rajapaksa. Join Amnesty in calling on the Sri Lankan government to account for his “disappearance” and to bring to justice those responsible. Help us get as many photos as possible on a special Flickr page set up for his case by Jan. 24, 2015, the fifth anniversary of his “disappearance.”

Here’s how to participate in the Flickr photo action:

- **Take a photo** of yourself, your friends, etc., holding a sign saying “#WhereisPrageeth?”
- **Put the photo in the body of an email** (and not as an attachment) with nothing else
- **Write your photo caption** in the subject line of the email
- **Email your photo to quick33supper@photos.flickr.com**
