



Q: What does Big Brothers Big Sisters do for our community here in SWLA?

Big Brothers Big Sisters' mission to create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth. Our goal is successful mentoring relationships for all children who need and want them, contributing to brighter futures, better schools and stronger communities for all. Our programs are proven to make an impact. Studies have shown that a child with a Big Brother or Big Sister is 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs, 52% less likely to skip school and 33% less likely to hit someone!

Q: Why is my participation so important?

By participating in BFKS 2020 you are directly contributing to enriching and improving the lives of local children! All funds raised stay right here in Southwest Louisiana. For some perspective, it takes \$1,600 to enroll and support a match for one year.

Q: How do I sign up?

Check out the next page in this packet—"Getting the Ball Rolling in 6 Easy Steps"! It will explain the very simple process to get involved from registering on-line to forming your team to raising funds in support of BBBSSWLA!





Q: Can my business participate?

Absolutely! We have lots of businesses that love to participate every year from forming employee teams to sponsoring a lane. BFKS is a great team building activity and a way for your company to show its support for our community. We have also included a page in this packet that describes the different type of sponsorship opportunities available!

Q: How much do I need to raise to participate?

We ask for a minimum donation of \$180 per team to compete. For a team of 6 players, that is just \$30 a person. However, the idea is for you and your teammates to go out and collect donations by spreading the mission of BBBS to your friends, family and coworkers! Some teams raise more than \$1,000 each year!

Q: What can I do to raise money?

The possibilities are endless! Start a coin war, sell baked goods, ask around the office, post on Facebook. We encourage you to be as creative and innovative as you like! Register your team!

It's easy to do online- just visit http://www.bbbsswla.org and click on the GREEN button "Bowl For Kids' Sake"! You can also download the bowler-fundraiser guide from the home page to help take you through the process.

Set a team fundraising goal.

AIM HIGH! The minimum required per team to bowl is \$180, but some of our top teams raise more than \$1,000 every year! To give some perspective, it costs on average \$1,200 to enroll and support a new match for one year.





Recruit your team!

You can have up to six bowlers. It could be friends, family, or co-workers. You've set an ambitious goal, so choose people who will help you exceed it! Want to get your workplace, civic club, place of worship, or sorority / fraternity involved? Contact us at bfks@bbbsswla.org.

Motivate your team to raise money for BBBS!

Agency FAQ Sheet

Who is Big Brothers Big Sisters?

- The nation's oldest, largest and most effective volunteer youth mentoring organization
- Big Brothers was founded in 1904 by Ernest K. Coulter and in 1977 was merged with Big Sisters to become Big Brothers Big Sisters of America
- Nationwide network of over 300 affiliates serving approximately 200,000 to 240,000 children a
 year
- Create, facilitate, and professionally support one-to-one, long-term mentoring relationship for youth who face adversity
- BBBS of SWLA began operations in 1979 under the umbrella of another organization and then separated to become Incorporated as an independent 501c(3) non-profit in 1984

What do we do?

- Our mission is to create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth.
- We partner with parents / guardians, volunteers and others in the community and hold ourselves
 accountable for each child in our program achieving higher aspirations, greater confidence and
 better relationships while also avoiding risky behaviors and achieving educational success

Why are our services needed?

- One of the building blocks of healthy development is an adult role model in the life of a child
- Many children in today's society are missing this figure due to situations of poverty and/or single-household living status
- BBBS-SWLA fosters success in children's outcomes by providing a positive adult relationship through our volunteer mentors

Who are the children we serve?

- Youth, ages 6 to 18 years old, residing in Southwest Louisiana.
- Enrolled through a parent/guardian or through a referral from a local school or agency
- The parent/guardian believes that their child could benefit from the presence of an additional caring adult in his/her life
- Over 80% of children served live in low-income households and are from single parent homes or living with guardians

What is our Impact?

National Research has shown that positive relationships between Littles and their Bigs have a direct and measurable impact on children's lives. By participating in our programs, Little Brothers/Sisters are:

- More confident in their schoolwork performance
- Able to get along better with their families
- 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs
- 27% less likely to begin using alcohol
- 52% less likely to skip school
- 81% reported that it changed their perspective on what they thought possible in life



Volunteer FAQ Sheet

What does it mean to be a "Big" and am I qualified to volunteer?

Being a Big involves spending time with a young person and fostering a healthy, positive friendship. Through this mentoring program a Big Brother or Big Sister can open a world of possibilities and opportunities for a Little simply by being a genuine friend. We ask that you make a one year commitment to meet with your Little a minimum of two times a month for two to four hours per visit.

As a Big, you and your Little will do everyday activities like playing sports, seeing a movie, cooking, going over schoolwork, washing the car, or just hanging out. And, as in any friendship, it is the spontaneous, small moments of shared fun or discovery that you will remember forever. This is the magic a Big brings to the life of a child, and that a Little brings to the life of a Big.

There are no special qualifications needed to be a Big. Being a Big, is something anyone can do. The only requirements are the willingness to be a friend, to have fun, and to see the world (and yourself) through the eyes of a young person. You will be asked to complete a screening process including an orientation, an interview, a background check, and for our community program, a home assessment as well.

While enrolled, BBBS will contact you monthly to discuss your match, offer any professional support needed, and to request yearly surveys so that we may track Match progress and success measures. Likewise, you can contact BBBS at any time with any questions, concerns or to share a great experience you have had!

Are there different mentoring programs I can be a Big in?

We offer many different mentoring programs to fit the needs of our Southwest Louisiana youth, as well as the interests of our volunteers. All programs require a one-year commitment. Our programs include:

- Community Based Mentoring: Adult Bigs, age 18 or older, provide Littles with one-on-one time and attention doing activities in their community. Through simple friendship, Bigs experience the joy of helping children discover a world of possibilities and opportunities. Typically, Bigs meet with their Littles two to four times per month for a minimum of one year.
- School Based Mentoring, Lunch Buddy or Reading Readiness: Adult Bigs, age 18 or older, provide Littles between K-5th grades with one-on-one time and attention in local schools during the child's lunch break or enrichment hour. Lunch buddy activities usually include eating lunch, playing games, or simply talking. Reading Readiness activities usually include assistance with reading and homework or simply talking when needed. For many children school can be a lonely and challenging place. As the friendship between a Big and Little evolves they discover ways to make school and learning fun. School based matches meet minimum two times a month, usually for one hour, for the duration of the school year. Matches may extend beyond one school year.

What kind of child will I be matched with?

Our Littles are youth, ages 6 to 18 years old, who reside in Southwest Louisiana. Our Littles come to BBBS either through a parent/guardian or through a referral from a local school or agency. Littles are from single and two-parent homes and are from a variety of socio-economic backgrounds. The parent/ guardian of our Littles believe that their child could benefit from the presence of an additional caring adult in his/her life. The parent or guardian must give permission for the child to participate.
