What's the difference between refugees and asylum seekers?

Asylum Seeker

A person who has left the country where they were born, because it's not safe to stay, and they are waiting to find out if they can settle in another country.

Refugee

A person who has left the country where they were born, because it's not safe for them to stay, and they have been allowed to settle in another country.








What support do refugees and asylum seekers get in the UK?

- I am allowed to work in the country I have moved to.
- I receive £5.39 a day for food, clothing and other basic necessities.
- I can't choose where I want to live. The government gives me a place to stay.
- I can open a bank account and have a National Insurance number.
- I am not allowed to work.
- I have to find my own home.
- I might be able to get financial help from the government if I don't have a job, I am too ill to work, I have a low wage or I am over the working age.
- I am waiting to find out if I can stay.





Were you correct?





Managing the cost of living





Asylum seekers have £39.63 per person, per week for things like food, clothing and things to stay clean and healthy.


What surprised you about what you've learned today?
