

- o Birdseed
- Spoons (for filling seed)
- Tables for working
- Old newspaper or cloths to protect surfaces
- o Card labels or tags (for writing messages on the finished feeders)

## 2. Advertise the event

- Create posters, social media posts, or newsletter mentions.
- Emphasise the eco-friendly and community side: "Turn a teacup into a treat for local birds and support a good cause!"

# 3. Set up the space

- Cover tables with old cloths or paper.
- · Lay out the cups, saucers, glue, string, and birdseed.
- Have a "demo" area where someone shows how to assemble a feeder.

## 4. Make the feeders

- Glue the cup to the saucer (either upright or tilted for artistic effect) let dry or set as per glue instructions.
- Tie or attach twine securely to the cup handle.
- Fill the cup and saucer with birdseed.
- Optionally, write a message on a tag e.g. "Made with kindness for our feathered friends".

## 5. Raise funds

- You could:
  - o Charge an entry fee or donation for making a feeder.
  - o Sell ready-made feeders at a fair, stall, or after Mass.
  - Offer "pay what you can" donations.

#### Top tips

- Have hand wipes or sanitiser ready (glue can be messy!).
- Allow time for glue to set fully before feeders are taken home.
- Make it part of your TEA with the SVP event serving tea and biscuits while people craft.
