

 Ask for donations of old cups and saucers — mismatched, ones are fine as long as they're safe to handle.

- Gather:
 - Recycled tea cups (ask parishioners ahead of time via bulletin / noticeboard / announcement at Mass)
 - Old candles for melting (or bulk wax if needed)
 - Wicks + a few glue dots
 - o A small slowcooker or portable hob for melting wax
 - A ladle or jug for pouring
 - Essential oils (optional for fragrance)
 - A table covering (old cloth, newspaper)

2. Advertise the event

- Advertise as a zero-waste, upcycling, and community-building activity.
- Emphasise that funds raised will support the SVP.
- Offer an option to sponsor a candle or donate materials

3. Set up the space

- Tables with enough space for making candles + enjoying tea
- Station with wax-melting equipment (safety first!)
- Tables for tea/refreshments
- Clearly marked donation/fundraising area

4. On the Day

- Coffee & cake first
- Let people relax, chat, and browse the candle station.
 - o Candle making station Offer two options:

Quick hands-on activity

- A volunteer or participant helps stick wicks in cups and pours melted wax
- Guests watch or help pour, then leave candle to set (collect later or next week)
 Buy a ready-made candle
- Have some candles pre-made (perhaps by your local Mini Vinnie or Youth SVP group or a project you support in the community eg. homeless shelter, refugee centre, nursing home)

4. Fundraising ideas

- Suggested donation per candle: e.g., £3-5 (or "what you can give")
- Option for people to donate materials (old tea cups or candle stubs)
- Extra donation for those who just want to support and drink tea but not make.
