Opening Prayer

Loving God, help us through meeting together to deepen our Vincentian friendship and bear witness to your compassionate and tender love, so that our hearts beat with the heartbeat of those living in poverty, and so that we come to see poverty through their eyes. Leader

Vincentians are renowned for their ability to quickly mobilise and create positive change in situations where help is needed. Through our actions and words we can become the compassionate face of Jesus in our world.

As Vincentians we see Jesus as a baby and his family in the stable, a refugee, born to a teenage mother, homeless, and vulnerable. We see Jesus on the cross, a prisoner, bullied, dying and in pain. These are the faces of Jesus we seek out, befriend and offer our support to.

From Pauls letter to the Colossians

Colossians 2:7

"Rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."

All that we are able to do is not in our own power but through our service and prayer. St Vincent said "Give me a person of prayer and they will be capable of anything." A tree stands tall offering shade and a place of shelter for the many who use it because it's roots are anchored deep. In the same way our service is rooted deep in the Gospel message of Jesus "Love one another as I have loved you". Pope Francis said that "Only by going deep will the branches grow upwards and bear fruit."

As a Young Vincentian will you commit to take an active part in helping those who you see are in need?


Final Prayer (*the response is pray for us*) Saint Vincent de Paul, **pray for us,** That we may be people of prayer, simple and humble.


Saint Louise de Marillac, **pray for us,** That we may feel God's reassurance in times of doubt.
